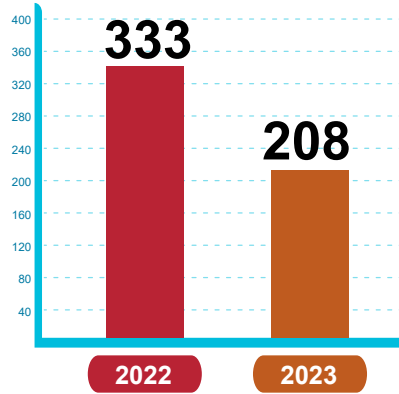

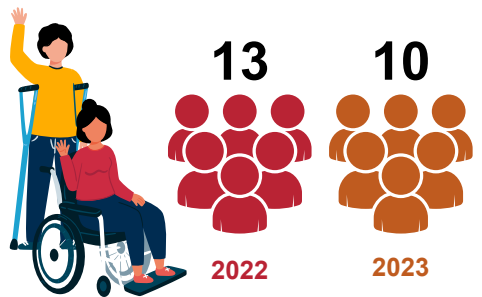
## Respondents Basic Profile

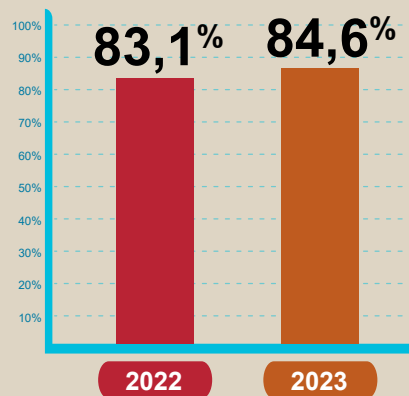

Applied their skills and knowledge frequently

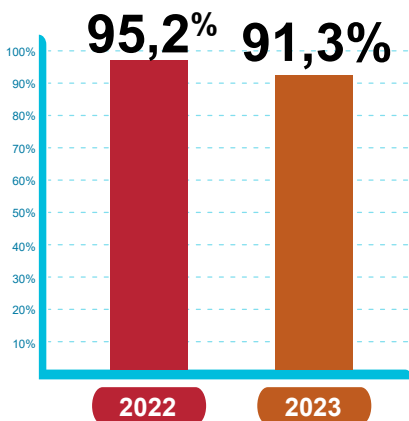

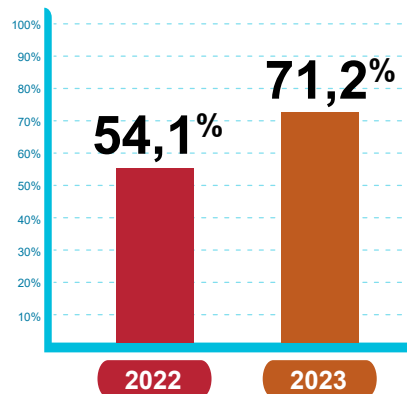

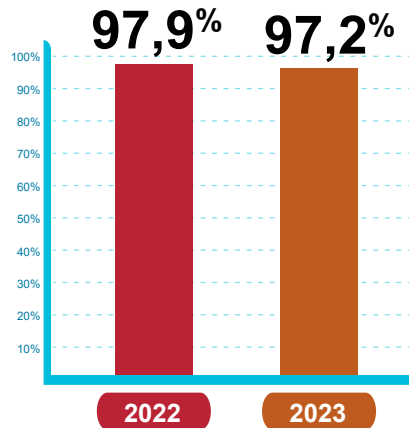

Viewed Australia positively

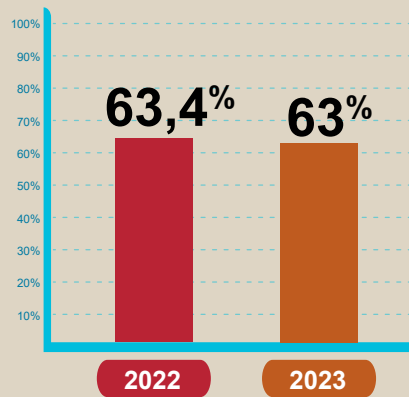

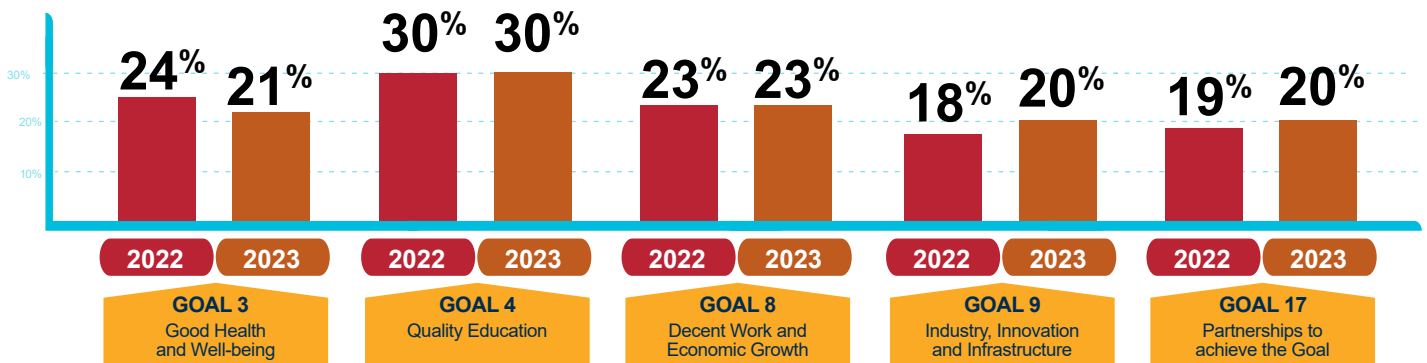

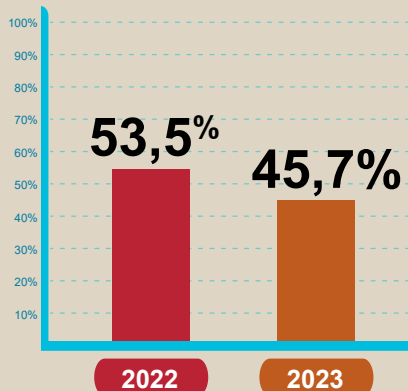

## Alumni contribution to cooperation between Australia and Indonesia

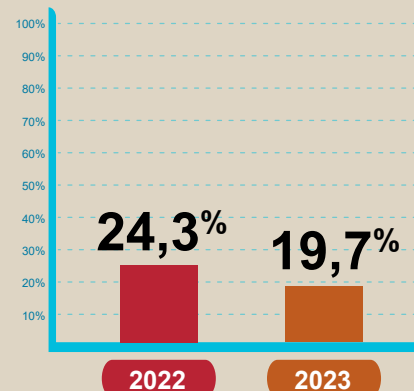
