Course background and objectives

Australia and Indonesia share a common goal of maintaining a peaceful, stable and prosperous Indo-Pacific. The Australia-Indonesia Partnership for Peace and Stability recognises our shared objective in reducing the risk of conflict in the region, strengthens the role of ASEAN-led regional architecture as a force for peace, and builds mutual understanding of strategic circumstances and approaches to conflict prevention.

The Partnership is a key vehicle for operationalising the principles of the 2026 Jakarta Treaty (the Treaty on Common Security) and deepening strategic trust. The Treaty builds on our existing extensive defence and security cooperation, including through the Australia-Indonesia Defence Cooperation Agreement, and is a recognition by both countries that the best way to secure peace and stability in our region is by working together.

Delivering a conflict prevention short course is practical cooperation agreed under the Australia-Indonesia Partnership for Peace and Stability and builds on the momentum of recent high-level engagements. The course is targeted to mid-career participants from Indonesian government agencies with a focus on foreign, defence and security policy and non-government organisations including think tanks and academic and civil society organisations.

Learning Objectives

The course will focus on the following learning objectives:

- Identify conflict drivers and risks of all types of conflict in the Indo-Pacific, with a specific focus on interstate and major power conflict
- Quantify and conceptualise the potential impact of conflict on Indonesia, Australia and the region
- Identify tools of statecraft which can be used to reduce risks of conflict. Approaches could range from diplomatic efforts to deterrence policies

- Discuss possible conflict prevention initiatives which could be delivered by Australia and Indonesia
- Foster innovation and collaboration in conflict prevention strategies
- Benchmark best practices and missed opportunities in conflict prevention through case studies, site visits, and expert lectures in Indonesia and Australia
- Map stakeholders in Indonesia, Australia and the region that contribute to the goal of maintaining peace in Indo-Pacific and identify potential areas of collaboration
- Exchange lessons and expertise in conflict prevention with their respective working units
- Participate in peace gaming exercises to practically test conflict prevention strategies
- Build deeper strategic trust and mutual understanding of Indonesian and Australian strategic circumstances
- Build networks with Australian institutions and experts for partnerships and future collaboration
- Create action plans (Award Project) to apply course learnings in their work and disseminate ideas

The course provider is expected to produce materials and training that can be communicated by participants at later stages to wider audiences in Indonesia. To achieve the above-mentioned learning outcomes, the proposed course offers a structured learning process by applying a range of learning methodologies:

- Classroom sessions
- Case studies
- Site visits, including to Australian Government (state and federal) agencies, the private sector and other relevant agencies
- Discussion and planning sessions
- Simulations and role plays
- Networking events
- Award Project model is used across all Australia Awards in Indonesia short courses. Participants develop a project, conduct required analyses, present the project plan at pre-course workshop, further develop the project during the in-Australia course, and present the implemented project at the post-course workshop

Dates and location

The final delivery dates and locations will be determined in consultation with DFAT and the provider selected through an open tender process. The proposed schedule is:

- Pre-course workshop in Indonesia: September 2026 (TBC)
- Short course in Australia: October 2026 (TBC)
- Post-course workshop in Indonesia: February 2027 (TBC)

Course participant profile

The course will have 20 participants from Indonesia and 5 participants from Australia. These participants are selected through a merit-based assessment process by an independent selection panel.

To apply for this course, you must be a representative of :

- Coordinating Ministry for Maritime Affairs and Investment
- Indonesian Coast Guard (BAKAMLA)
- Research institutions, think tanks or universities
- CSOs
- Political staffers

General criteria for the applicants

- Minimum three years' experience in a relevant role
- Government representatives: Staff to Echelon III level
- Other sectors: preferably middle-management to upper-management level
- Applicants must have minimum Diploma (D3) or higher qualification
- Application is endorsed by the applicant's supervisor
- Commitment to prepare and implement an Award Project, an individual or small group development project as part of the course
- Commitment to engage actively and foster networks with multiple stakeholders
- Commitment to disseminate learning from the course with colleagues and peers.
- Applicants are expected to have **professional working proficiency in English**. The applicants' English language competency is part of the selection process. The assessment of language competency is based on a virtual (online) interview and any additional evidence provided by the applicant (proof of studies or living in an English-speaking country, working in an English-speaking environment, completion of studies in English, language courses or language tests)
- Applicants who currently hold a scholarship funded by the Australian Government are not eligible to apply for the short course
- Participants will be selected through a competitive process whereby applicants submit:

- (1) Responses to selection criteria (3 questions)
- (2) CV outlining their roles and responsibilities in the sector

Women from disadvantaged backgrounds and people with disability are encouraged to apply.

To be eligible, all participants must:

- not have Australian permanent residence status or be applying for a permanent residency (applies to the Indonesian applicants);
- be a citizen of and residing in Indonesia (applies to the Indonesian applicants);
- not be current serving military personnel;
- not be married or engaged to, or be a de facto of a person who holds, or is eligible to hold, Australian or New Zealand citizenship or permanent residency (applies to the Indonesian applicants);
- have been working in Indonesia and in an area relevant to the short course preceding the date of the proposed commencement of the short course (applies to the Indonesian applicants);
- be able to satisfy all requirements of the Department of Home Affairs for a visa;

- be able to participate in the nominated short course activities at the time and for the duration proposed by Australia Awards;
- be able to travel without family members as DFAT will only provide visa support and funding for individual participants, not their family members.

Gender equity will be a consideration and encouraged but not a constraint, given that participants are selected by position and position responsibilities. Australia Awards in Indonesia will convene an independent selection panel to review applications and select participants based on merit against the above participant profile.

Applicants shall submit their application forms directly through online application by **14 June 2026 at 23:59 WIB**.

The selection panel will convene to select up to 25 participants. All applicants will be informed of the outcome of the selection process by **July 2026**.

Practical Arrangements

Logistics – Australia Awards in Indonesia will cover the cost of:

- Return travel to and from the pre-course workshop
- Return flights from the nearest airport to the course location
- Return travel to and from the post-course workshop
- Per diems to cover living expenses while attending the course (in Australia AUD82.20 per day)
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) insurance for the duration of the course in Australia
- Accommodation during pre-course and post-course workshop and the course in Australia (please see further information below)
- Transportation to and from the airport, to and from meetings and site visits
- Visa to Australia
- Visa to Indonesia for the Australian to join in the Indonesia workshops.

- In Australia, participants will share two-bedroom apartments, each participant will have their own bedroom
- In Australia, men will share apartments with men and women will share apartments with women
- During the pre and post-course workshops each participant will have their own hotel room

- The course material will be made available in English
- Interpretation or language assistance will not be provided

Steps of Application

Participants will be selected through a competitive process whereby applicants submit their responses to selection criteria (4 questions) and their background information outlining their roles and responsibilities in the sector through an online application. Gender equity will be a consideration and encouraged but not a

constraint, given that participants are selected by position and position responsibilities. Australia Awards will convene an independent selection panel to review applications and select participants based on merit against the above participant profile.

- Shortlisted candidates will be invited for a virtual (online) interview in **July 2026**.

Further instructions and virtual interview invitation will be emailed to shortlisted candidates a few days before the interview. If a candidate fails to join the virtual interview, their applications will not be considered by the selection panel.

The selection panel will convene to select up to 25 participants. All applicants will be informed of the outcome of the selection process by **July 2026**.
