# Split-Site Masters Program – EOI Process



1

The Ministry of State Secretariat notifies the Indonesian Government Organisations (IGO), about the Split Site Masters Scholarship Program. Australia Awards in Indonesia notifies the Australian and Indonesian universities. IGOs are invited to submit Expressions of Interest (Eoi).



2

IGOs identify potential Australian and Indonesian universities to partner with.



4

AAI reviews the Eoi for compliance especially in Indonesian agency capacities, study programs, bilateral engagement, and funding availability.



3

IGOs submit Eois via Cognito Form to AAI (IGOs can submit more than one Eoi each requiring a separate form).



5

AAI provides the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) and the Indonesian Ministry of State Secretariat with a list of recommended partners.



6

DFAT and Ministry of State Secretariat review the recommendations and make a final decision on selected Eois for the year.



7

AAI notifies successful and unsuccessful agencies and organisations.



8

AAI holds a consultation workshop for successful agencies, Indonesian universities, and Australian universities.

9

All stakeholders sign Letter of Understanding (LoU) that outlines the agreement between parties under the SSMP Program.
